## YOUR NEW RETAINER (ESSIX)

HOME-CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Cleaning clear retainers is essential for maintaining good oral hygiene and ensuring that the retainers stay clear and free from bacteria and odors. Here are step-by-step instructions for patients on how to clean their clear retainers **DAILY**:

## Materials you will need:

- 1. Your clear retainers
- 2. A soft-bristle toothbrush (designated for retainer cleaning only)
- 3. Mild, unscented, and non-abrasive dish soap or a specialized retainer cleaning solution
- 4. A clean, empty container
- 5. Lukewarm water
